Dear St. Timothy Folk,

Welcome to the Season after Pentecost! Sunday, June 2nd, is the second Sunday after Pentecost,

Many in the church know this season as "the long green season", which can last as much as six months, depending on the date of Easter. It is also known as Ordinary Time, not because it is common, but because the weeks are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis refers to numbers in a series. We get the word order from its Latin root ordo. Ordinary Time includes the season following Pentecost and the season of Epiphany following Jesus' Baptism. The color green, which symbolizes hope, life, and growth, is used for this season as well as the Season of Epiphany.

For the Lectionary, we will be following the Revised Common Lectionary, Year B, track 2. This track gives us Old Testament readings which connect with the Gospel reading. The New Testament lessons for the next few months are taken from Paul's second letter to the church at Corinth and his letter to the church at Ephesus. The Gospel readings heard during this season from the Gospel according to Mark teach us about the life and ministry of Jesus, and help us to grow in our life of faith and ministry through his teaching. There will be a side trip into the Gospel of John in August.

On June 23rd at Coffee Hour, I will offer information about our Triennial General Convention which begins that day in Louisvile.

There will be a First Sunday lunch on June 2nd, and some other activities in the coming months. We have some Outreach activities planned for the summer. See elsewhere in this newsletter for more

What is Ordinary Time in the Liturgical

Calendar? It comprises the longest time on the liturgical calendar when the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and miracles while on this earth. One symbol often found in Ordinary Time is comprised of two fish and a basket of bread — symbolizing Jesus' "Loaves and the Fishes" miracle.



It may be referred to as the "green season," because green is the usual liturgical color for this period of the church year.

St. Timothy's Episcopal Church Vestry Summary May 19, 2024

All vestry members were present.

After prayer and a call to order, the vestry discussed progress on new goals that have been put into action: the Mentor Program and Lunch Bunch which is slated to start this summer.

Rev. Linda provided updates on those who are sick and hospitalized. She spoke of contacting other clergy who can assist in providing care in case of emergency while she is out of town. She reminded us that Fr. Frank is the visiting priest on 5/26. Plans are in place for his visit.

She also asked about increasing the CDF (Clergy Discretionary Fund) by using a previous practice of allotting the loose offering in the plate on the 3rd Sunday each month. Senior Warden will talk to the treasurer and report back. Rev. Linda suggested an informational article about the CDF for the Parchment.

Committee reports were provided as available.

<u>Communications</u> will offer a Tech Sunday on June 9th to provide all with information about the website and social media.

<u>Education</u> Rev. Linda will be providing three sessions on Celtic Christianity in June, July, and August. Dates will be provided later.

<u>Facilities</u> Update on clean up of the dirt basement area and normal facilities fixes. Facilities asks that members stop adjusting the thermostats' seasonal programming. The vestry discussed hanging the Original Church Window that is now


